Médaille Francois-Xavier Garneau Medal

The CHA is pleased to inform its members of the shortlist for the association's highest honour, the Francois-Xavier Garneau Medal. This award is made only every five years and honours a single outstanding Canadian contribution to historical research. All books published by Canadian historians from 2003 - 2007 are eligible and over 150 have been submitted and considered by the jury. The prize, in the amount of \$2,000, will be awarded at the association's annual general meeting at Concordia University in Montreal, May 30 - June 1, 2010.


