HISTORIANS IN THE NEWS / HISTORIENS À LA UNE

Christopher Armstrong, York University, received the Ontario Historical Society's J.J. Talman Award for his book, *Moose Pastures and Mergers: The Ontario Securities Commission and the Regulation of Share Markets in Canada, 1940-1980*. This award recognizes the best book on Ontario social, economic, political or cultural history published in the past three years.

Constance Backhouse, University of Ottawa, received the Ontario Historical Society's Joseph Brant Award for her book *Colour-coded: A Legal History of Racism in Canada, 1900-1950*. This award recognizes the best book on multicultural history in Ontario published in the last three years.

Anthony Barrett, UBC, received a Killam Research Fellowship for his project, *Imperial Power and the Female Elite in the Early Roman Empire*.

Peter Baskerville, University of Victoria, and **Chad Gaffield**, University of Ottawa were featured on CBC Radio national news in mid-June for their multi-million dollar pan-Canadian research project, The Canadian Century Research Infrastructure (CCRI).

Carl Berger, University of Toronto, has been named the inaugural holder of the May Gluskin Chair in Canadian History.

Michael Bliss, University of Toronto, has been named University Professor.

Chad Gaffield, University of Ottawa, was chosen Professor of the Year at the University of Ottawa for 2002. As this year's recipient, he will give a public lecture in November and will be presented with the Award for Excellence in Teaching. Since Dr. Gaffield previously received the Award for Excellence in Research in 1995, he becomes the first professor to be named both Professor of the Year and Researcher of the Year at the University of Ottawa.

Bob Gidney and **Wyn Millar**, UWO, received the Riddell Award for their article "The Christian Recessional in Ontario's Public Schools." This award recognizes the best article on Ontario's history published in the past year.

Jean O'Grady received the Ontario Historical Society's Alison Prentice Award for her book, *Margaret Addison: A Biography*. This award recognizes the best book on women's history published in the past three years.

Bryan Palmer, Canada Research Chair of Canadian Studies at Trent University, received a 2001 Choice Gold Seal for outstanding Academic Publications for his book, *Cultures of Darkness: Night Travels in the Histories of Transgression*.

David Schimmelpenninck, Brock University, received the Chancellor's Chair For Research Excellence. This 3-year appointment will allow Schimmelpenninck to complete his study of pre-Revolutionary Russian perceptions of Asia.

Veronica Strong-Boag and **Carole Gerson**, UBC, received the Raymond Klibansky Prize from the Canadian Federation for the Humanities and Social Sciences for their book, *Paddling Her Own Canoe: Times and Texts of E. Pauline Johnson, Tekahionwake*.
