

IN MEMORIAM / DÉCÈS

Ann Condon passed away in 2002. She had been a member of the CHA since 1981.

Simon Fraser University lost one of its outstanding citizens on May 5, 2002 when **John Hutchinson** passed away at Vancouver General Hospital where he had been admitted only a short time previously. He was 63 and was scheduled to teach through September 2004 when he would have retired. John was a faculty member in the Department of History from 1966 and he played a large role in the shaping of the university in its formative years. His own department also bears the stamp of his vision as articulated in successive curriculum revisions and in the development of collegial principles for departmental government. John was a scholar of remarkable breadth and depth who specialized in the history of public health and social welfare, the history of

humanitarian ideas and activities and in the social and political history of Russia. Among the awards, citations and honours he received was the 1998 Jason A. Hannah Medal for Excellence in the History of Medicine given by the Royal Society of Canada. John was also a memorable teacher who brought high standards to the classroom and a most commendable dedication to the craft of teaching. He is survived by his sons Gordon and Ian, daughters Kate and Julia and grandchildren Olivia and Patrick.

Lewis G. Thomas passed away. He had been a member of the CHA since 1946 and was President of the CHA 1972-1973.
