During the past year the **University of Alberta Archives** has acquired the records of Mel Hurtig, author, publisher and political leader; J. Peter Meekison, former Vice President Academic, member of the Royal Commission on Aboriginal Peoples; Assistant Deputy Minister for Intergovernmental Affairs under Peter Lougheed and constitutional advisor to other Alberta Governments; the records of History Professor John Foster; the records of the Alberta Law Reform Institute; and the records of Theatre Network and Nexus Theatre. The Archives arranged and described the records of John Charyk, Alberta educator and the records of the University's Photographic Services Department. It will be arranging and describing the records of Senator Donald Cameron, former Director of the Banff Centre, and the records of the Presidents Wyman, Gunning, and Horowitz. In addition, the Archives completed its "Guide to Native Sources at the University of Alberta Archives". The Archives is pleased to announce the launch of its WEB Site which includes a description of much of its holdings, an explanation of the use of the Archives Network of Alberta database which includes detailed descriptions of the holdings in 13 Archives in Alberta, and Access to Other Canadian Archival Resources on the Internet.
