The Albert B. Corey Prize in Canadian-American Relations, jointly sponsored by the American Historical Association and the Canadian Historical Association, will be awarded in December 1982 at the annual meeting of the American Historical Association for the best book dealing with the history of Canadian-American relations or the history of both countries. The prize carries a cash award of \$2000.
