POLICY FOR TRAVEL SUBSIDIES FOR THE CHA ANNUAL CONFERENCE IN VANCOUVER, JUNE 1983

SSHRC, through SSFC, will likely grant the CHA funds to help defray some of the travel and accommodation costs of the 1983 conference.

A) To oversee the distribution of these funds the CHA executive has named an ad hoc committee composed of the Treasurer (Chairman), the CHA President (or his delegate), and the 1983 Programme Chairman (or his delegate).

B) The CHA will pay as much as possible of travel and accommodations costs for members and invited guests, but does not undertake to pay the full extent of such expenses. All should first apply to their own institutions for partial subsidy.

C) Applicants for subsidies must be CHA members or invited guests participating in the annual conference and have registered with the CHA.

DIRECTIVE CONCERNANT LES SUBVENTIONS AUX DEPLACEMENTS POUR LE CONGRES ANNUEL DE LA SHC

Le CRSHC, par l'intermédiaire de la FCSS, accordera à la SHC, une certaine somme pour aider à défrayer le transport et le séjour de ceux/celles qui assisteront à la conférence annuelle de 1983, à Vancouver.

A) L'Exécutif de la SHC a confié la distribution de ces fonds à un comité ad hoc, composé du président (ou de son représentant), du trésorier et du président du Comité du programme de 1983.

B) La SHC défraiera, dans la mesure du possible, les coûts de transport et de séjour des membres ou des invités(es) qui assisteront à la conférence. Elle ne s'engage pas à rembourser ces coûts au complet. Tous(tes) les participants(es) devraient d'abord s'adresser à leur institution pour être subventionnés, ne serait-ce qu'en partie.

C) Les personnes qui feront application pour obtenir des subventions doivent être membres en règle de la SHC ou être invités(es) à participer au congrès et s'y être inscrits(es) sous la couverture de la SHC.

D) In certain cases travel advances will be granted upon application to the Treasurer before May 16, 1983.

E) All who wish to receive subsidies from the CHA must complete and submit a Travel Expense Claim, accompanied by original receipts, to be received at the CHA office by June 24, 1983.

F) Categories of participants, in order of priority, are as follows:

1) CHA President: accommodation for four nights; all travel expenses; hospitality and incidental expenses.

2) Participants: (Those giving papers, commentators, chairmen of sessions, panelists, those reporting to CHA Council or the AGM): Charter return airfare, or mileage at \$0.20 mile/\$0.12 kilometre (not to exceed charter return airfare); bus service to and from airports; accommodation at \$38 for two nights; incidentals at \$20 for two days; CHA registration fee of \$25.

3) Council Members and Programme Committee: for those attending both Council Meetings and for members of the Programme Committee: Charter return airfare or mileage rates (as in no. 2); bus service to and from airports; four nights accommodation and per diem incidentals (as in no. 2); CHA registration fee of \$25. For Council members attending only one Council meeting: Charter return airfare or mileage rates (as in no. 2); bus service to and from airports; two nights accommodation and per diem incidentals; CHA registration fee of \$25.

4) Graduate Students: Up to \$4000 will be set aside to aid graduate students from outside the Vancouver area. Priority will be given to those in the theme areas of the conference as well as the history of Canada: charter return airfare or mileage (as in no. 2); bus service to and from airports; accommodation at \$38 for one night; incidentals at \$20 for two days; CHA registration fee of \$25.

5) Those attending: CHA members, who pay the CHA registration fee and attend the conference, will also be entitled to apply for a partial subsidy, if funds permit, at the rate of No. 4 above.

E) Les personnes qui souhaitent bénéficier d'une subvention de la SHC devront remplir un formulaire de réclamation de frais de voyage, accompagné des reçus justificatifs. Le tout devra parvenir au bureau de la SHC, le 24 juin 1983, au plus tard.

F) L'ordre de priorité selon lequel les participants(es) seront éligibles aux subventions est le suivant:

1) Pour le président de la SHC: chambre à l'hôtel pour quatre nuits, tous frais de transport; frais de représentation et faux-frais.

2) Pour les collaborateurs-trices: (ceux-celles qui doivent présenter des communications, faire des commentaires, présider les séances, participer à des tables rondes, établir les rapports pour la SHC ou l'Assemblée générale annuelle): avion aller-retour, vol nolisé, ou un tarif de \$0.20 le mille/\$0.12 le kilomètre (ne devant pas excéder le coût d'un vol nolisé); service d'autobus (aéroport-hôtel et retour); séjour pour deux nuits au tarif de \$38; allocation de \$20 pour les faux-frais pendant les deux jours; frais d'inscription de \$25 à la SHC.

3) Pour les membres du Conseil et les membres du Comité du programme (qui doivent assister aux deux réunions du Conseil et les membres du comité du programme): avion aller-retour, au tarif d'un vol nolisé ou taux milliaire (comme en 2); logement pour 4 nuits et allocation de faux-frais (comme en 2); autobus (comme en 2); inscription à la SHC \$25. Pour ceux/celles qui n'assisteront qu'à une réunion du Conseil: logement pour deux nuits et faux-frais; avion aller-retour au tarif d'un vol nolisé; autobus et inscription à la SHC \$25.

4) Pour les étudiants(es) diplômés(es): une somme de \$4 000 sera réservée pour certains(es) étudiants(es) diplômés(es) venant de l'extérieur de la région de Vancouver. Priorité sera donnée aux spécialistes des grands thèmes de la Conférence ainsi que de l'histoire du Canada; avion aller-retour, au tarif d'un vol nolisé; service d'autobus; inscription à la SHC \$20; \$38 pour une nuit; faux-frais pour deux jours à raison de \$25 par jour.

5) Pour les autres participants(es): Les membres de la SHC qui s'inscriront à la SHC et assisteront au congrès auront aussi droit à une aide partielle, si l'état des ressources le permet et selon les modalités décrites en 4.
